


Coronavirus (COVID-19): Risk Assessment Action Plan for potential opening from 1st September 2020

The sole purpose of this risk assessment is to support schools in preparing for the return to school in September 2020 for all pupils while reducing the risk of coronavirus transmission. The risk assessment has been written in collaboration with a number of local authorities.

- For the purpose of this risk assessment, the term 'coronavirus' to refer to coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- This should be viewed alongside relevant advice and guidance from the Department of Education and reflect any additional subsequent guidance issued to schools.





School-specific arrangements relating to risk assessment that may need additional detail:





Capacity and organisation of teaching spaces: All classes and nursery are now able to attend school. All classrooms can be accessed by outside doors. Children will sit at tables in rows. Transition has not taken place. Extra cleaning at key points of the day. Staggered start and end times to the school day. Soft furnishings removed from classrooms. All outdoor spaces to be used as much as possible.

Arrival to and departure from school: staggered start and end to the day. Parents and children to observe social distancing. No parents in foyer. Parents to phone into school. If they wish to talk to teacher, they will have to make an appointment. KB available.

Movement around the school: Children who are old enough will be encouraged to socially distance themselves when it is possible to do so. Movement around school is limited to classrooms and toilets.

Classroom allocations: classes used for normal attendance. Spare classrooms in ½, ¾ and 5/6 can be used for changing /overspill/interventions.

Timetable arrangements: All staff will work towards returning to a normal timetable whilst ensuring risk controls are in place.

Role of teaching assistants: staff will be deployed into the bubbles. A small number of staff will work with different bubbles.

Breaktime plan: Bubbles are allocated designated play areas.

Lunchtime plan: sandwiches/lunches to be eaten in classroom. Rooms cleaned before and after eating.. Grab bags to be delivered from kitchen, then return to the classroom.

Catering staff: will provide grab bags/ hot boxes ordered through the normal app.





Cleaning: extra cleaning of surfaces through the day. Dudley have been contacted to ascertain which products can be used. Jane went through chemicals with all staff on 1st Sept.

Toilets: sensible approach, one at a time, self distanced where possible. Intimate cleaning policy adhered to with PPE for staff. Cleaner paid extra to clean all toilets at lunchtimes.

Staffroom and offices: staff not allowed in the school office. Photocopying to be left in tray on counter. Staffroom can be used for drinks etc but self distancing to be observed. Guidelines shared with staff on 1st sept.

Transport: cars to use car park. Self distance on arrival/ entering school. Taxis for RBD children reviewed in line with guidance. Green gate for KS2, Silver gate for the EYFS and KS1. Key workers children to enter the school office. Other children to enter school through outside classroom doors.

Classroom expectations: routines to be discussed with staff on Sept 1st

Pupil expectations: staff to talk to children on Sept 3rd
