

Starting Primary School in September 2019

Why not apply for a place online? If your child was born between 1 Sept 2014 and 31 Aug 2015 they will be due to start primary school in September 2019.

You **MUST** complete an application either online at www.dudley.gov.uk/ admissions or by completing an application form from your home local authority by 15 JANUARY 2019. You can include five school preferences on the application; there is nothing to gain by only putting one preference.

The online system will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from 1 Oct 2018 until the closing date for applications on 15 JANUARY 2019

Attendance at a nursery attached to a primary school will not guarantee admission to that particular primary school or give any advantage to the pupil in the admissions process.
