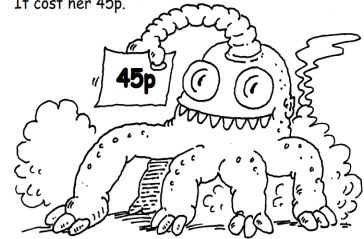

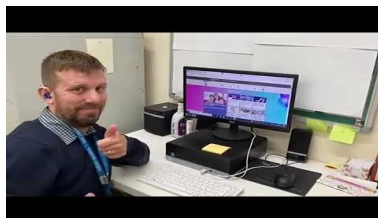
RBD News
