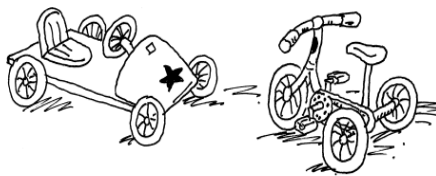
## Maths Challenge

### At the toy shop

The toy shop stocks tricycles and go-carts.

The tricycles have 3 wheels.
