Beattie, the mascot, will be out on his adventures too! Keep walking, running, scooting and cycling!

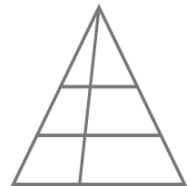
Polite reminder ...

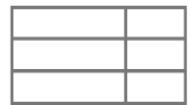
Maths Challenge
