What happens now?

Talk to a trusted member of the family or close friend.

Is my child curious?

Look for the signs



Burnt matches lying around



Burnt pieces of paper left about



Scorch marks on carpets or soft furnishings in their bedroom

How can I help?

Never leave matches or lighters around the house, even in pockets or handbags. Lock them away or put out of reach.



Tell your child never to touch matches and lighters from an early age. They are dangerous and can burn. They are for grownups with NO EXCEPTIONS.



What can I do now?

Stay calm.

Don't frighten or punish your child for being curious.



HOWEVER:

They must understand the danger they are in.

Talk about the consequences.

Seek help.
