#### Diarrhoea and Sickness

Can we remind parents that we follow the local authority guidance and request that children are not sent back into school until 48 hours after the last bout of sickness/ diarrhoea. We are aware that this is inconvenient in many cases, and you may not believe your child is ill, but you will appreciate that we do this in all cases and it should reduce the risk of infection for all children in school. As an example, if your child is sick at lunchtime on a Tuesday, they should not return to school until the Friday morning, provided there have not been any further episodes of vomiting or diarrhoea.



## Starting Primary School in September 2023

Why not apply for a place online? If your child was born between 1 Sept 2018 and 31 Aug 2019 they will be due to start primary school in September 2023.

You MUST complete an application either online at www.dudley.gov.uk/admissions or by completing an application form from your home local authority by 15 JANUARY 2023. You can include five school preferences on the application; there is nothing to gain by only putting one preference.

The online system will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from **1 Oct 2022** until the closing date for applications on **15 JANUARY 2023** 

Attendance at a nursery attached to a primary school will not guarantee admission to that particular primary school or give any advantage to the pupil in the admissions process.

#### **Key Stage 2 News**

It has been another busy week in KS2

The years 5 and 6 children went on our first trip in a long time on Tuesday to the Think Tank in Birmingham. We had a great time learning and investigating ideas about our Science topic on Space.
