# Scarlet Fever/Strep A Bacteria Infection.

Scarlet fever or Strep A is a highly contagious bacterial infection that can be extremely serious - although it is treatable with antibiotics.

In England and Wales it's a notifiable disease meaning health professionals must inform local health protection teams of suspected cases so they can be treated quickly and possible outbreaks brought under control. Spread in coughs and sneezes, cases occur most often in the winter. Symptoms include a rash, a sore throat, flushed cheeks and swollen tongue- known as 'strawberry tongue' because of its appearance.

If you think you, or your child, have scarlet fever, do seek medical help as soon as possible. Every child has the right to an education

Early treatment with antibiotics is important as it helps reduce the risk of complications and the spread of the infection to others.

We have had cases in several year groups.
