- Edith Cavell1865-1915
- Edith was a nurse during WWI.
- She worked in Belgium and stayed there when it was overrun by the German army.
- She saved the lives of both Allied and German soldiers, but she also helped many
- British soldiers escape to safety.
 In 1915 she was sentenced to death by the German authorities for helping 'spies'
- escape.
- She was seen as a martyr.

How do we know? Evidence:

Written records, the court account of her trial, and artefacts tell us about nursing during these periods. There are letters that she wrote home.
