Housing in The Local Area Subject Knowledge

The housing estates to the north of Ashwood Park Primary School form a residential suburb which has been built in phases after the Second World War. The area was open farmland. Only in late Victorian times was the street, known as Belle Vue developed and there was building along New Street. There have been some recent infilling of modern houses. Most of the houses are semidetached and detached houses with some developed as terraced. It seems the estates were developed for families as there are no high rise blocks nor hardly any flats.
